How is security information controlled in the Biohacking Village?

- **Research rules of engagement.** Device maker's published coordinated vulnerability disclosure, where it exists, will apply in the Lab.
- **Clear Labeling.** Cards clarifying rules of engagement and reporting are on each device.
- **Controlling participation.** BHV-logo wristbands identify researchers who have attested to act in the best interest of patients in researching and disclosing potential issues.
- **Default deny for media.** We are only willing to work with vetted members of the press who get the stories right and avoid sensationalism, for accurate, nuanced, and contextualized reports.
